- The pattern of cruciformity
  - Although...not...but...in order that...
  - Although existing in the form of God, He did <u>not</u> consider equality with God a thing to be grasped, <u>but</u> emptied Himself <u>in order that</u> other might be saved
  - Although...not...but...in order that...therefore...
  - The 'therefore' suggests the hope that belongs to those who live according to the pattern of the cross.

- God has a long history of bringing triumph out of apparent defeat.
  - The song of Hannah
  - Rescue the persecuted
  - Deliver the captives
  - Raise the dead
- The groundwork for hope through the cross is laid. God is able to reverse what at first appears to be defeat.

- The basis of our hope is the resurrection of Christ
  - Jesus suffered, died, was buried, and raised
  - Those who have died with Him ['united with Him in the likeness of His death'] will be glorified with Him

- For what are we hoping
  - That this mortal will put on immortality
  - The transformation of our bodies
  - Glory
- We live in a period of hope, between the decisive battle and the final victory. How should we live?
